AZALEA Karens

☀️☀️ 18" h 24" w 18"p SPRING

(Karens Azalea) Flowers are a bright peach pink color, but appear two weeks later than PJM Rhododendron. Evergreen Azalea. Burgundy fall color.

AZALEA Stewartsonian

☀️☀️ 1.5'h x 2'w 1'p SPRING

(Stewartsonian Azalea) Bright orange-red flowers. Burgundy fall foliage.



BUXUS Sempervirens Aureo-variegata

☀️ 3' h 3' w 15"p

(Variegated Dwarf English Boxwood) Variegated small round yellow and green foliage. Compact habit. Great broadleaf evergreen for a shady area.

BUXUS Sempervirens Newport Blue

☀️☀️ 3'h 3'w 1.5'p

(New Port Blue Boxwood) Globose boxwood that has blue-green leaves; compact habit; lends itself to formal hedges or knot gardens.



BUXUS x. Green Mountain

☀️☀️ 6' h 3' w 1.5'p

(Green Mountain Boxwood) An upright grower with dark-green, glossy leaves. Vigorous yet compact plant. Good green winter color.



BUXUS x. Green Velvet

☀️☀️ 3' h 3' w 1.5'p

(Green Velvet Boxwood) Globe growth habit. Round full-bodied boxwood well suited for low hedges. Vigorous habit and good green color throughout winter.

ILEX meservae Blue Prince

☀️☀️ 5' h 5' w 18"p

(Blue Prince Holly) Broad, upright habit. Hardy evergreen shrub. Lustrous dark bluish-green foliage. Needed as a companion to female blue holly.

ILEX meservae Blue Princess

☀️☀️ 3' h 5' w 18"p WINTER BERRY

(Blue Princess Holly) Broad, upright habit. Hardy evergreen shrub. Abundant dark red fruit and lustrous dark bluish-green foliage. Female needs male nearby to bear fruit.

RHODODENDRON Aglo

☀️☀️ 5'h x 4'w 18"p SPRING

(Aglo Rhododendron) Flowers are peach pink with rose markings. Burgundy red fall color.



RHODODENDRON PJM Elite

☀️☀️ 4'h x 5'w 18"p SPRING

(PJM Elite Rhododendron) Bright pink-lavender flowers.

ABIES albo Green Spiral

☀️ 30' h 12' w 5-6'bb

(Green Spiral Fir) 'Green Spiral' has dark green glossy needles, with twisting stems spiraling outward and down. Deep green color, stylish habit, and moderate size

ABIES koreana Cis

☀️ 3'h x 4'w 18"p

(Cis Fir) Radially held, dark green needles lie flat to the stem and serve as a backdrop for the attractive small brown buds at the branch tips. Flattened, spherical, formal, clean, tidy appearance and glistening foliage.



ABIES koreana Horstmann's Silberlocke

☀️ 12' h 4' w 3'bb

(Silberlocke Fir) The needles of this small tree are recurved, displaying the silver-white underside. This characteristic gives a gleaming color and texture effect of uncommon beauty.



CHAMAECYPARIS nookatensis Jubilee

☀️ 20' h 8' w 4'p

(Jubilee Nootka False Cypress) An extremely narrow weeping Alaskan cedar, It is fast-growing & very distinctive. Older plants exhibit a wonderful, spire-like main trunk with gracefully draping branches.



CHAMAECYPARIS nookatensis Pendula

☀️ 24-30' h 15-20' w 4'p

(Weeping Nootka False Cypress) Pyramidal habit. Interesting evergreen with horizontal branching and weeping foliage. Grows to 10' in 10 years.



CHAMAECYPARIS obtusa Blue Feathers

☀️ 8'h x 5'w 12"p

(Blue Feathers Cypress) This plant is soft in form as well as texture. Tiers of feathery downy-looking foliage on an upright broad habit. Juvenile foliage is muted blue.



CHAMAECYPARIS obtusa Crippsii

☀️ 4'h x 3'w 3-4'bb

(Crippsii Hinoki Cypress) Slow growing, bright yellow foliage. Very dramatic accent plant but will tend to have some foliage burn in hot sun climates.



CHAMAECYPARIS obtusa Flabelliformis

☀️ 8'h x 5'w 1'p

(Flabelliformis Cypress) Dwarf Hinoki Cypress with emerald green foliage and three-dimensional texture. The foliage cups downward at the ends of the branches, adding softness and airiness. Interesting focal point in the rock and perennial gardens.



CHAMAECYPARIS obtusa Mariesii

☀️ 2' h 2' w 1'p

(Mariessii Dwarf Hinoki Cypress) This multi-stemmed, irregular, globe-shaped plant has short, thin foliage which is variegated, creamy-white against dark-green. Does well in full sun.



CHAMAECYPARIS obtusa Nana Lutea .

☀️ 3.5' h 2.5' w 1'p

(Dwarf Golden Hinoki Cypress) Slow growing, dense pyramidal form. Excellent rock garden subject. Yellow counterpart to 'Nana Gracilis'



CHAMAECYPARIS obtusa Spiralis

☀️ 8'h x 3.5'w 2'p

(Spiralis Cypress) This upright Hinoki is unusual, with its narrow form and deep, dark green, fine textured foliage. Slow growing with branches spiraling outward and upward from the trunk. An ever-changing natural sculpture.



CHAMAECYPARIS obtusa Tsatsumi

☀️ 3' h 3' w 1'p

(Tsatsumi Cypress) Dark green rugose foliage twists and curls exposing mahogany branches. Compact habit, good choice as an unusual accent plant in the rock garden or smaller landscape.

CHAMAECYPARIS obtusa Tsatsumi Gold

☀️ 3' h 3' w 1'p

(Tsatsumi Gold Cypress) An oriental looking Hinoki with yellow threadlike drooping foliage. Thin branches coil chaotically throughout each other exposing smooth reddish bark and the inner light green foliage.



CHAMAECYPARIS pisifera Boulevard

☀️ 6-10'h x 3'w 2'p

(Boulevard Cypress) A popular garden standby with soft, plumy, silver blue foliage and a full, pyramidal habit.

CHAMAECYPARIS pisifera Cream Ball

☀️ 2' h 2' w 10"p

(Cream Ball Cypress) Tight, slow-growing ball with creamy-white foliage. The light, soft textured foliage makes this an eye-catching new introduction from Vancouver, B.C. A must for the rock garden enthusiast.

CHAMAECYPARIS pisifera Curley Tops

☀️ 7' h 4' w 1.5'p

(Curley Tops Cypress) A wonderful new plant, "Curley Tops" has distinctive curled needles and bright powdery blue foliage, adding textural interest and luminescent color to the landscape. Broad compact habit.

CHAMAECYPARIS pisifera Golden Pin Cushion

☀️ 3' h 3' w 10"p

(Golden Pin Cushion Cypress) Variegated Golden dwarf moss cypress. Very slow-growing, spreading, velvety bun. Prized plant for the oriental or rock garden. Best color in full sun.



CHAMAECYPARIS pisifera Mops

☀️ 3'h 3'w 1.5'p

(Mops Cypress) Brilliant gold threadlike foliage that retains it's color in heat and humidity; low mounding habit



CHAMAECYPARIS pisifera Mops

☀️ 3'h 3'w 2'p

(Mops Cypress) Brilliant gold threadlike foliage that retains it's color in heat and humidity; low mounding habit



CHAMAECYPARIS pisifera Pici

☀️ 5'h x 6'w 18"p

(Pici Cypress) This hardy new offering has blue green, soft, juvenile foliage that turns to a bronzed purple in winter. Widely spaced, awl-shaped needles expose the stem giving 'Pici' an open airy look.



CHAMAECYPARIS pisifera filifera Aureovariegata

☀️ 6' h 4' w 24"p

(Variegated Threadleaf Cypress) A variegated form of the threadleaf cypress with a mounding form and strong bicolor effect of green and creamy-golden yellow.



CHAMAECYPARIS pisifera filifera Tony's Gold

☀️ 3'h x 3'w 2'p

(Tony's Gold Cypress) A bright-yellow selected form named for Tony Costantino from Pennsylvania. Broad, conical form which holds it bright yellow color well.

CHAMAECYPARIS thyoides Top Point

☀️ 4' h 2' w 1.5'p

(Top Point Cypress) Blue-green foliage, wine colored stems and narrow form make this an excellent choice for a compact specimen. In winter the foliage has an attractive purple blush. Not as adaptable to wet sites as the species.



JUNIPERUS chinensis Daub's Frosted

☀️ 1' h 5' w 18"p

(Daubs Frosted Juniper) Unusually appealing due to the bright two-color effect produced by new, light golden yellow growth contrasting with the feathery, bluish-green interior foliage. Great accent for a sunny, well-drained site where color is needed.

JUNIPERUS chinensis Gold Lace

☀ 2' h 3' w 18"p

(Gold Lace Juniper) A hardy semi-dwarf evergreen with a low, wide-spreading habit. Retains its striking golden colored foliage.



JUNIPERUS squamata Dream Joy

☀ 1.5" h x 4' w 1' p

(Dream Joy Juniper) Similar to 'Blue Star' but with an overlay of creamy yellow in the needles giving it a frosted effect.

JUNIPERUS communis Brynhfyrd Gold

☀ 5' h x 1' w 1.5' p

(Brynhfyrd Gold Juniper) This new Scottish selection is a variation of 'Compressa' with the growing points emerging yellow in spring. The foliage matures to blue green in summer while retaining a slight muted yellow undertone.



JUNIPERUS squamata Holger

☀ 3.5' h 3' w 2' p

(Holger Juniper Std.) A dense, wide-spreading juniper with bright creamy-yellow new foliage that contrasts beautifully with the older, blue foliage producing a stunning dramatic bicolor effect.



JUNIPERUS communis Oblonga Pendula

☀ height varies w/ training 2'p

(Oblonga Pendula Juniper) Small, bright green needles held close to pendulous branches. Can be grown upright or mounding. Great accent plant.



JUNIPERUS virginiana Gray Owl

☀ 2' h x 4' w 18" p

(Gray Owl Juniper) Light blue, fine, textured foliage. Excellent resistance to disease.



JUNIPERUS horizontalis Limeglow

☀ 1.5' h 5' w 2' p

(Limeglow Juniper) Feathery foliage with an electric chartreuse color growing in a spreading vase shape provides a striking contrast to other greens in the garden. Withstands hot, dry conditions, holds bright color even in hot summer climates.

JUNIPERUS x-med Golden Joy

☀ 1' h x 4' w 1.5' p

(Golden Joy Juniper) This new selection offers an improved choice among the multitude of golden junipers with its brilliant yellow year-round color. This easily grown selection has a comparatively slow rate of growth.



JUNIPERUS horizontalis Mother Lode

☀ 1' h 5' w 12" p

(Mother Lode Juniper) A bright, golden yellow sport of 'Wiltoni', 'Mother Lode' holds bright color all summer in full or partial sun. Fall brings a deep yellow-orange becoming tinged with plum by winter for all-season attraction.



PICEA abies Formanek

☀ height varies w/ training 2.5' p

(Formanek Norway Spruce) A radically prostrate form, this plant will become a densely matted spreading carpet over time. If staked up its branches will cascade down creating a pendulous specimen. The perfect plant to creep over and around rocks.



JUNIPERUS squamata Blue Star

☀ 1.5' h 4' w 2' p

(Blue Star Juniper) The name 'Blue Star' is wonderfully descriptive. As broad and high, the short branches form a star-like appearance.



PICEA abies Frohburg

☀ height varies w/ training 2.5' p

(Frohburg Spruce) Short, slender, medium-green needles and a slower growth rate compared with the more common Picea abies 'Pendula'. With staking, 'Frohburg' exhibits a narrow, strict weeping habit, with a full spreading skirt.



PICEA abies Jogeua

☀ 2.5'h x 5'w 1'p

(Jogeua Spruce) Long slim branches are distinctive and individual, pointing up or out, giving this compact bright green ball a different look.



PICEA abies Motala

☀ 2.5'h x 5'w 1.5'p

(Motala Spruce) A novel form of Norway Spruce that is rarely found in the trade. Minute glaucous striations on the top of the needles create a silver blue cast. Blunt tipped needles that radiate out and downward on stout short vertical branches.



PICEA abies Rubra Spicata

☀ 30" h 12' w 3'p

(Red Tip Norway Spruce) Tree type. Red new growth: a very unexpected color for a spruce. For about two weeks in the spring the new growth is deep red gradually changing to red-brown then green.



PICEA abies Sherwoodii

☀ 8'h x 5'w 3-4'bb

(Sherwoodii Spruce) Semi-dark green conifer with a graceful fan shape. Compact, striking ornamental.



PICEA abies Tompa

☀ 4'h x 3'w 1.5'p

(Tompa Norway Spruce) Fresh green needles and a compact habit make this slow-growing Norway Spruce a great selection for those smaller landscape and rock gardens. Its wide conical shape is similar, but a more desirable alternative, to the Alberta Spruce



PICEA bicolor Howell's Dwf. Tigertail

☀ height varies w/ training 2'p

(Howell's Dwarf Tigertail Spruce) Colorful bicolor, a flat-topped bush when young, it can be maintained in this form by pruning upward growing shoots which emanate from rose purple buds. Eventually develops into a pyramidal tree.



PICEA glauca Humpty Dumpty

☀ 5'h x 5'w 1.5'p

(Humpty Dumpty Spruce) This extremely dense plant is short and plump. As wide at the base as it is tall, and less than two thirds the height of the Dwarf Alberta Spruce. Unique almost perfect pyramidal form.



PICEA glauca Pixie Dust

☀ 18" h x 10" w 2'p

(Pixie Dust Spruce) Pixie Dust is a dwarf that combines the delightful color's of 'Rainbow's End' with the form and texture of 'Pixie'. A dramatic statement in a tiny package, perfect for container or rock gardens.



PICEA glauca Rainbow's End

☀ 6' h 1.5' w 3.5'p

(Rainbows End Dwarf White Spruce) In spring, the new growth is light green. In mid-summer, the second flush is nothing but extraordinary. Bright, creamy-yellow new growth contrasts dramatically against the dark-green older foliage.



PICEA glauca Sanders Blue

☀ 5'h x 3'w 40"p

(Sander's Blue Spruce) Attractive, slate blue form of Alberta Spruce. This dwarf blends well with all conifers and perennials and serves as a novel focal plant.

PICEA omorika Aurea

☀ 25'h x 8'w 4'p

(Aurea Spruce) This full-sized tree with a narrow spire-like habit has unique coloring. The blue green needles are brushed with yellow, giving 'Aurea' a tricolored appearance.



PICEA omorika Pendula Bruns

☀ 30' h 12' w 40"p

(Bruns Weeping Serbian Spruce) A weeping form of Serbian spruce selected at Bruns Nursery in Germany. The strong weeping habit of this tree is much more accentuated compared with omorika 'Pendula'

PICEA orientalis Skylands

☀ 20' h 8' w 4'p

(Skyland's Spruce) Typical habit of the species but slow developing in early years. Glowing yellow year round. More green contrast on lower, shaded interior.



PICEA pungens Globosa std.

☀ 4.5' h 3' w 24"bb

(Globe Spruce) Dwarf conifer with globose dense form and excellent blue color



PICEA pungens Islei's Fastigiata

☀ 20'h 6'w 3-4'bb

(Islei's Fastigiata Blue Spruce) Ornamental blue spruce with strong fastigiata habit; looks like a fat steel blue cigar.



PICEA pungens Procumbens

☀ 3' h 7' w 2'p

(Prostrate Blue Spruce) Similar to 'Pendula' in color, but used as a spreading, undulating ground cover. Very effective when draped over a rock wall or slope

PICEA pungens Shilo- Weeping

☀ 25'h x 8'w 3-4'bb

(Shilo-Weeping Spruce) A weeping selection which has an upright leader with the side branches hanging down in a dense curtain of blue foliage. This plant continues to develop its weeping character and beauty as it ages.

PICEA pungens St. Mary's Broom

☀ 2'h x 3.5'w 1.5'p

(St. Mary's Broom Spruce) A dwarf blue selection with relatively long, wide-angled needles for a slow-growing plant. Slower than 'Montgomery' it is reliably mounding or globose without any tendency to grow a leader.

PINUS banksiana Schoodic

☀ 2.5'h x 8'w 3.5'p

(Schoodic Jack Pine) This pine is an exceptional ground-hugging selection, dense and low growing, with short emerald green needles. Cold hardy and adaptable to poor soils.



PINUS bungeana Rowe Arboretum

☀ 25'h x 10'w 3'p

(Rowe Arboretum Chinese Lacebark Pine) Noteworthy for its neater, more compact, and uniform growth habit as compared to the species. A beautifully shaped tree when young that displays a patchwork of white, green, and brown bark as it matures.



PINUS contorta Chief Joseph

☀ 8'h x 6'w 3.5'p

(Chief Joseph Pine) A bright beacon in the winter landscape with deep golden yellow winter color. Spring through fall, the color for this slow growing pine is medium green changing color dramatically in fall.



PINUS densiflora Oculus Draconis

☀ 30'h x 12'w 3-4'bb

(Dragon's Eye Pine) Bright yellow variegation on the needles. It is a very striking conifer for the garden, especially in winter.

PINUS leucodermis Iseli Fastigiata

☀ 5-10'h x 3' w 3.5'bb

(Iseli Fastigiata Bosnian Pine) A superior cultivar to fit smaller outdoor living spaces. Stately presence without overwhelming its space. Dark green needles parallel to the trunk. Columnar, distinct vertical habit.



PINUS mugo Donna's Mini

☀ 1'h x 2'w 18"p

(Donna's Mini Dwarf Mugo Pine) Super slow growing, needles are very short, covering thickly held branchlets. True dwarf.



PINUS mugo Jakobsen

☀ 2.5'h x 3.5'w 2.5'p

(Jakobsen Mugo Pine) This exciting new selection from Denmark has the aesthetics of a skillfully manicured bonsai specimen. Dark green needles are set against the strong trunk. Slow growing. No need for pruning.

PINUS mugo Pot o' Gold

☀️ 2' h 3' w 18"p

(Pot o' Gold Mugo Pine) Spring through summer, the mounding dwarf mugo pine stays neat, tidy, and compact. As fall comes to a close and winter approaches, it begins to glow, faintly at first then a bright lemon yellow by mid winter.

PINUS parviflora Glauca Nana

☀️ 15' h 5' w 4'p

(Glaucous Nana Pine) Short, blue-green needles. The main branches grow in an irregular manner, tending to ascend, on this comparatively narrow *Pinus parviflora*.



PINUS pumilla Blue Dwarf.

☀️ 3' h x 6' w 2'p

(Blue Dwarf Siberian Pine) Selected for the spring display of carmine red cones that contrast with the superior blue needle color. Densely covered with twisted needles and has a horizontal spreading habit.



PINUS strobus Blue Shag

☀️ 3' h 4' w 18"p

(Blue Shag Eastern White Pine) Fast becoming a popular selection of the dwarf eastern white pine. This Waxman introduction is an outstanding, compact, reliably rounded form. Excellent for a variety of landscape uses.



PINUS thunbergii Thunderhead

☀️ 20' h x 15' w 2'p

(Thunderhead Japanese Black Pine) Eye-catching, brilliant white candles strikingly contrast with the thick glossy needles. Dense, billowy, cloud-like form.

TAXUS cuspidata Nana Aurescens

☀️☀️ 3' h 5' w 18"p

(Yellow Dwarf Japanese Yew) Outstanding sunny-yellow, low spreading plant. Eye-catching brilliant foliage.



THUJA occidentalis Aurea

☀️☀️ 3' h 3' w 18"p

(Golden Globe Arborvitae) Round-shaped cultivar with golden feathery foliage. Plant retains its shape without shearing and is very hardy.



THUJA occidentalis Gold Spot

☀️☀️ 8' h x 4' w 3-4'bb

(Gold Spot) Moderate growing, naturally dense and conical. The yellow green foliage is striking.



THUJA occidentalis Golden Tuffet

☀️ 2' h 4' w 24"p

(Golden Tuffet Arborvitae) In hues of golden orange this pillow-shaped tuffet grows wider than tall, reminiscent of a mushroom cap. The foliage has an unusual braided texture. Adaptable to all soil types and tolerant of full sun to part shade.



THUJA occidentalis Hetz Midget

☀️ 1.5' h 2' w 1'p

(Hetz Midget Globe Arborvitae) Slow growing and dense globe habit with soft green foliage in vertical layered sprays.

THUJA occidentalis Linesville

☀️ 3' h 4' w 24"p

(Linesville Arborvitae) From Linesville, PA, this dwarf arborvitae has the perfect spherical habit that lends form and structure to the garden. The foliage is a fine, almost lacy, texture with soft silver-green color.

THUJA occidentalis Pendula

☀️☀️ 2'p height varies w/ training

(Weeping Arborvitae) Lacy foliage hangs gracefully, exposing the attractive, undulating branches reminiscent of a bygone era. Form depends on cultural care. Unstaked it becomes a broad mound with outreaching branches.

THUJA occidentalis Sherwood Frost

☀️🌳 3' h 4' w 2'p

(Sherwood Frost Arborvitae) This slow growing, broad upright cultivar has foliage tips brushed a light creamy-white color. Variegated foliage radiates as a sparking beacon in the winter landscape. Best plated in full to part sun.



THUJA occidentalis Sherwood Moss

☀️🌳 2' h 2-3' w 18"

(Sherwood Moss Arborvitae) This showy semi-dwarf globe arborvitae features lace-like mossy green foliage with a feathery texture. An excellent accent plant.



THUJA occidentalis Smaragd

☀️🌳 12'h x 3.5'w 4-5'bb

(Emerald Arborvitae) From Denmark. Narrow, uniform habit and glossy green color year round. Spider mite resistant.



THUJA occidentalis Smaragd

☀️🌳 5-8'h x 2-4'w 4-5'bb

(Smaragd Arborvitae) Narrow, uniform habit and glossy green color in summer and winter. Resistant to spider mites.



THUJA plicata Whipcord

☀️🌳 5' h 4' w 18"p

(Whipcord Arborvitae) Multibranched shrub with long tendrils of foliage giving a very droopy, pendulous mop effect. A nice glossy green summer color and typical bronze cast in the winter.

TSUGA canadensis Albospica

☀️🌳 30' h 12' w 4'p

(Albospica Canadian Hemlock) A lovely, open-growing hemlock, with snowy-white-tipped foliage, standing out in stark contrast against mature, dark green needles. Bright color splash for deep shade.



TSUGA canadensis Ashfield Weeper

☀️🌳 12'h x 4'w 3'p

(Ashfield Weeper Hemlock) Long branches that arch downward exposing smooth gray bark. Pendulous branchlets are heavily covered with dark green needles. Whimsical appearance.



TSUGA canadensis Canadian

☀️🌳 4-5'bb

(Canadian Hemlock) This tree is sheared for a dense form but is not tightly sheared.



TSUGA canadensis Cole's Prostrate

☀️🌳 2' h 6' w 18"p

TSUGA canadensis Gracilis

(Gracilis Hemlock) Low-growing, spreading form with a very regular arrangement of needles and shoots, giving this plant a nice, neat, uniform appearance.

TSUGA canadensis Horsford's Contorted

(Pig Tails' Canadian Hemlock) Twisted branches and coiled, contorted branchlets. This is an interesting and surprisingly attractive tree. Plant in an unconventional garden location for fun.



TSUGA canadensis Moon Frost

(Moon Frost Juniper) eye-catching, bright white new growth, reminiscent of frost on a moonlit night. Older, inner foliage retains light tones giving this plant an overall whitish appearance. In winter the white foliage is blushed with pink.

(Loowit Hemlock) Small blunt needles, small branches form a tight bun. Selected from seed collected in the alpine region of Fukushima prefecture, Japan. Loowit is the Native American name for Mt. St. Helens.
